



Caddie Rules

The PGA's National Club Championship allows competitors to identify one caddie for each round of competition. Caddies must register at the designated registration area with their competitor each day of competition.

The host sites in Palm Springs **do not** have caddie programs. Competitors will need to arrange caddies independently.

Caddies are encouraged to utilize the [Official Caddie Bib](#).

Caddie Definition

Competitors are permitted to identify one person as their caddie during competition. The caddie is permitted to carry the player's clubs or the player may keep their clubs on his or her cart. The caddie is not required to physically carry the clubs to serve as the caddie. Each group is assigned 2 carts for competitors. In the event there is an open seat on a cart, caddies may ride in the cart but never on the back of carts.

Spectator carts are available to purchase from the golf shop on a first come first serve basis for handicap or ADA needs.

Caddie Rules

- All [USGA caddie rules apply](#) (e.g. - caddies may not receive advice from spectators)
- Contestants shall be responsible for the conduct and behavior of their caddies during competition and during any stoppages of play - If the caddie's action breaches a Rule or would breach a Rule if the action was taken by the player, the player gets the penalty under that Rule.
- Caddies should wear golf-appropriate rubber-soled shoes.
- Caddie assumes all risk and danger incidental to participation in the event and releases the PGA of America, PGA from any and all liability. All caddies agree to the [Liability Release and Terms & Conditions](#).
- Failure of any caddie to conform to the above shall result in his/her immediate removal from club property. The PGA staff and Committee shall reserve the right to determine caddie eligibility and may relieve the caddie of his or her duties at any point during competition.
